#### **Energy** Conservation and Efficiency

- ✓ Have a home energy audit, calculate your home's carbon footprint.
- ✓ Make home energy efficiency second nature.
- ✓ Consider solar energy systems.
- ✓ Use the outdoors efficiently, especially for cooling the house and drying clothes.

#### **Purchasing** and Recycling

- Reduce, re-use and recycle.
- **✓** Embrace simple living.
- ✓ Use supplies made from natural, recycled or recyclable materials.



- ✓ Carpool whenever possible.
- ✓ Consider driving an alternate-fueled or highly fuel-efficient car.
- **☑** Be mindful of vacation travel and its carbon footprint.
- **☑** Remember the simple things about fuel efficiency.

#### **Water Conservation**

- ✓ Minimize indoor water use by not letting water run and taking shorter showers.
- ✓ Minimize outdoor water use with water-wise landscaping and rain barrels.
- ✓ Upgrade your plumbing.
- Reconsider your landscaping.

#### **Buying and Sharing Food**

- **☑** Buy locally grown food.
- ☑ Buy organic and naturally grown food.
- ✓ Shop carefully and use cloth shopping bags.
- **I** Eat lower on the food chain (fruits and vegetables).
- ✓ Don't waste food.
- ✓ Compost food scraps.
- ✓ Avoid drinking bottled water.
- ✓ Support your local food bank or pantry.
- ☑ Grow food in your backyard, school yard, or parish garden.
- ✓ Join the local food movement.

- ☑ Connect the landscape with urban forests. ☑ Minimize chemical use.
- ☑ Create a water-wise landscape.
- ☑ Create a wildlife habitat. ✓ Plant for pollinators.

- ☑ Consider a community garden.
- ☑ Become a Georgia Master Gardener.

✓ Plant native plants.

- ✓ Prepare the soil well and compost.
- Become a citizen scientist.
- ✓ Use correct planting procedures.
- ☑ Create a meditation garden.
